COVID-19 Vaccine Update: January 14, 2021

Martin County is supporting the Florida Department of Health's efforts to distribute the COVID-19 vaccine to our residents. The Florida Department of Health (FDOH) in Martin County is the lead agency on vaccine distribution in our area. Vaccines are being distributed by the state to the Florida Department of Health in Martin County and Cleveland Clinic Martin Health, however, the supply is limited. And so, we have asked for assistance from our legislative delegation to advocate for regular and increased shipments of the vaccine to FDOH. Martin County is working with our partners and committed to making this information from the state available to our residents.

As of Thursday, January 14, we have the following information to share:

- The Florida Department of Health in Martin County has received 3,300 vaccine doses which have been allocated to priority groups, including frontline health care personnel with direct patient contact and individuals 65 and older, as outlined in Governor Ron DeSantis' Executive Order 20-315.
- The Florida Department of Health in Martin County has allocated all doses of the vaccine that
 have been received from the state and does not currently know when additional supplies will be
 available. FDOH Martin will announce via their website at www.MartinCountyHealth.com and
 Twitter @GoHealthyMartin when additional vaccines are received and appointment scheduling
 resumes for drive thru vaccination clinics.
- Due to high demand and limited vaccine supply, FDOH Martin is no longer maintaining a wait list
 for vaccine appointments. To help alleviate high call volume, FDOH Martin is working with local
 and state partners to identify an online appointment system to assist with scheduling as supplies
 become available.
- At this time, Cleveland Clinic Martin Health has allocated their vaccine supply and suspended scheduling eligible patients. Scheduling will resume as soon as additional vaccines are received. Continue to monitor my.clevelandclinic.org/landing/covid-19-vaccine/florida for updates.
- The list of Publix pharmacies that are vaccinating patrons has been expanded, however the plan
 does not yet include any stores in Martin County. For up-to-date information related to

- The Village of Indiantown has announced that Florida Community Health Centers will be offering a clinic on Saturday, January 16 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. to vaccinate those 65 and older and health care personnel with direct patient contact. Supplies are limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. For more information, visit the Village of Indiantown's website.
- The Stuart VA Clinic, located at 3501 SE Willoughby Boulevard in Stuart, is offering vaccinations
 to veterans age 75 and older who are enrolled with the West Palm Beach VA Medical Center for
 care. Please note that vaccine supplies are limited. For appointments, call (772) 288-0304. For
 more information, visit www.westpalmbeach.va.gov.
- The CDC has contracted with CVS and Walgreens to vaccinate patients and staff in long-term care facilities in Martin County as part of the community response.
